CORK International 2011
29er and Byte CII North American Championship
August 15-18, 2011
Kingston, Ontario



1. INVITATION:

CORK/Sail Kingston and Ontario Sailing invite sailors in: **29er, Club 420, Byte CII, Laser, Laser 4.7, Laser Radial, O'Pen Bic and Optimist Dinghy** to **CORK International 2011**.

- There is a fleet minimum size of 10. Please work with your class association to insure at least that number.
- **2011 Ontario Sailing Grand Prix Development Series** for Laser, Laser Radial, 29er, club 420 and Optimist.
- For the **Laser** and **Laser Radial** this is a youth event (18 years of age and younger as of Dec 31st 2011 – U19)
- For the **Optimist Dinghies** this is a 3 day event (August 15th to 17th). Fleets will be divided according to the CODA rules:
 - Red Fleet – 13 to 15 years of age as of December 31st, 2011 (YOB 1996-1998)
 - Blue Fleet – 11 to 12 years of age as of December 31st, 2011 (YOB 1999-2000)
 - White Fleet – 10 years of age or under as of December 31st, 2011 (YOB >= 2001)
 - Green Fleet – eligibility for the Optimist Class Green Fleet is subject to the following criteria:
 - Skippers shall be 15 years of age or under as of December 31st, 2011
 - Skippers shall not return to Green Fleet competition after having competed in other Optimist fleets (i.e. in White, Blue, Red or similar advanced Optimist fleets) except where no Green Fleet competition was offered at such events; and Upon placing three times in 1st, 2nd or 3rd place overall in a regatta, or any combination thereof, a skipper shall advance to his/her appropriate age group fleet (White, Blue or Red).

2. SITE:

The regatta will be sailed from Portsmouth Olympic Harbour (POH), site of the 1976 Olympic Sailing events, the 2007 Volvo Youth Sailing ISAF World and the 2010 Optimist North American Championship. Racing will take place on the fresh waters of Kingston Harbour.

3. ELIGIBILITY:

The Regatta is open to members of the invited classes who have met all class membership and measurement requirements. Participants must have completed registration and paid all event fees before beginning official competition. (Competitors in the 29er class are reminded that both skipper and crew must be members of the class association.)

4. RULES:

Racing during this event will be governed by the *rules* as defined in the *Racing Rules of Sailing*. In the event of conflict in any translation, the English version will prevail.

4.1 Appendix P may apply.

4.2 Rule 61.1 “Informing the Protestee” is changed as follows:

(a) Add to rule 61.1(a) “The protesting boat shall inform the Race Committee of the boat/s being protested at the finishing line immediately after finishing.”

(b) **Rule 61.1(a)(2) “If the hull length of the protesting boat is less than 6 meters, she need not display a red flag” is deleted.**

4.3 Decisions of the International Jury will be final as provided in rule 70.5.

4.4 Only the prescriptions of the Canadian Yachting Association to rule 68 and all the prescriptions to Appendix F Will apply. They can be found on the CYA website <http://www.sailing.ca> . They will be stated in full in the Sailing Instructions that will be available at registration.

5. ENTRY & FEES: (We accept VISA, MC, Debit Cards, Money Orders, Bank Drafts or cash)

The entry fee covers racing, daily debrief sessions with senior coaches, a regatta souvenir and pasta/light dinner after racing on 2 days. Also included is a per diem fee to the City of Kingston for use of facilities.

If the completed entry form and entry fee is received at the CORK/Sail Kingston office on or before July 31, 2011: the fees are:

Single handed CAD \$170.00 + 13% HST

(3 day – Optis) CAD \$160.00 + 13% HST

Double handed CAD \$260.00 + 13% HST

After July 31, 2011 the fees are:

Single handed CAD \$210 + 13% HST

(3 day – Optis) CAD \$200 + 13% HST

Double handed CAD \$320 + 13% HST

Please note - On-line and in person registrations will close at 2100 (9 pm) on Sunday August 14th. Check in will be open until 0900 on Monday, August 15th.

7. QUALIFYING SERIES:

If, by the end of registration on Sunday, August 14th,

- the 29er class has over 40 registrants,
- The 420 class has over 70 registrants,
- The Laser or Laser Radial class has over 80 registrants,

There will be a qualifying series for that class.

8. PRIZES & AWARDS:

In consultation with the class associations, CORK provides a variety of awards. For each One-Design fleet CORK medals will be awarded to the top three finishers. Additional prizes will depend upon the number of competitors in the fleet. Some class associations may provide their own additional awards.

9. COACHES & COACH BOATS:

Coaches must register. On line registration is available. Coaches will be issued a numbered flag which they must display while in the racing area and will be expected to monitor a CORK safety channel on their VHF radios, be available to assist in an emergency and attend the coaches meeting each morning. There is no coach fee but a \$20.00 deposit for the flag is required.

10. CHAPERONES / SUPERVISORS:

Yacht clubs and sailing schools are strongly encouraged to send groups of sailors. Please note that the club or sailing school is responsible to provide adequate support and supervision for their team.
